2 Timothy 4:2 Paul says, "preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching."

This is a verse that many have heard before, but as usual with scripture I found something I hadn't seen before. At the end of verse 2 it says, "with great patience." 
But we are patient for a reason!
