"Mommy, my stomach hurts," complained little sevenyear-old Sara Floy. The mother ignored her daughter. Children always complain about something. "Mom, my stomach hurts," she said again a few days later. The mother, this time, gave her a chamomile tea.

"Mommy, my stomach hurts," Sara complained for the third time. This time the mother took her to the doctor. In effect, the girl was sick. She had a ball of hair the size of an apple in her stomach. Others and this is the worst, go swallowing sins. Their conscience accuses them again and again, but in the long run the conscience also gets tired and stops talking. The ball keeps growing until it destroys mind, soul and heart.

Whatever the ball of hair that is in our soul, in our memory, in our conscience, Christ can dissolve it. He is the Savior of everything: body, soul and spirit. How awful must be the feeling in the heart, conscience and mind of this disease called sin when kept growing untreated in our inner being.
